155E Daniel TAPLEY (1815 - 1881)

Daniel TAPLEY was the youngest child of Richard TAPLEY (1770 - 1824), Tailor of Folkestone, and Elizabeth TAPLEY, nee STEVENSON. Daniel was born at Folkestone, Kent, in 1815, and was baptised there on 6 September 1815. (1)

Daniel grew up in Folkestone, and like his brothers became associated with the sea, and rising to Master Mariner, in the British Naval Service.

Captain Daniel TAPLEY was given charge of the Barque TENASSERIM, and was engaged in trade between India and China, working for the East India Company. For many years he was the Master Attendant at Moulmein, Burma, and filled various appointments in the service of the East India Company. He continued in the service when it was transferred to the British Government.

Captain TAPLEY took an active part in the second Burmese War, being in charge of a Flotilla, transporting troops to Martaban and Rangoon. He also engaged in storming parties, for which activities he was honorably mentioned to the British Government.(2)

MOULMEIN- A city in Burma, was the capital of the Tenasserim Division, on the Gulf of Martaban, an arm of the Andaman Sea, and was about 100 miles South East of Rangoon. Lying on the Salween River, 28 miles from the sea, it is at the confluence of the Ataran and Gyang Rivers. Moulmein is a road hub, also a Port, shipping chiefly Teak and Rice. The city and surrounds have many noted Pagodas and caves. Moulmein was the chief city of British Burma from 1827 to 1852. (3)

There were two vessels at the time that carried the name TENASSERIM, one of British Registration No 30718, a vessel of 216 tons of Calcutta, and another built at Moulmein in 1841 of 760 tons. This was a Steam vessel of 220 H.P., and carried variously 4 and 11 guns. The Marine Establishment, Senegal, comprised the Master Attendant and three Assistants. Captain TAPLEY was appointed Second Assistant to the Master attendant in the Maritime Service, and was in charge of the Port of Moulmein. (4)

It was while at Moulmein, Burma, that Daniel TAPLEY, Commander of the TENASSERIM, aged 26 years, on 12 June 1841, married Mary Jane KINSMAN, aged 17 years, at St Matthew's Church, Moulmein. The Chaplain who performed the marriage was Arthur HAMILTON, and the Witnesses were W.C. MCLEOD, E.A. BLUNDELL, and I. LOGAN. (5)

Daniel and Mary were to have three children over the next few years.

155E1 Daniel Thomas TAPLEY, born at Moulmein on 15 April 1844.

155E2 Edward Charles TAPLEY, born 29 September 1845, at Moulmein.

155E3 Mary Elizabeth TAPLEY, born 26 February 1847, at Moulmein. (6)

In November of 1861, Captain Daniel TAPLEY was put in charge of Kidder Force Dockyard, which then included Naval Storekeeper, Builder and Surveyor.

He resigned in April of 1862, due to ill health, having obtained leave to England on Medical Certificate. (7)

He had been approximately 30 years in Calcutta and Moulmein, and retired to England on a Pension, living at Ivy cottage, Worth, Kent. Worth is a village outside Sandwich in Kent.

His wife, Mary Jane, died there on 3 May 1866, at home of Heart Disease and Cerebral Congestion. She was aged 40 years at this time. (8)

After his wife died, Daniel TAPLEY, decided to emigrate to South Australia about 1869, with his children.

Shortly after his arrival in South Australia he was appointed a Warden of the Marine Board, and in spite of his poor health he was a regular attendee at the meetings of the Board, and dedicated to his duties with the board. (9)

The most common function of the marine Board, was to meet and adjudicate in Nautical matters, particularly to make enquiries into strandings, wrecks, and so on. (10)

As part of his duties with the marine board, he was on board the ship MUSGRAVE, only a few weeks prior to his death. (11).

Captain Daniel TAPLEY was described as a genial and active gentleman; an authority on Nautical matters, and an enthusiastic Yachtsman, being a Rear-Commodore of the South Australian Yacht Club. (12)

Apart from these activities, he was hardly ever seen outside of his house 'Cavendish', in the fashionable suburb of Caversham at Woodville. (13)

Daniel TAPLEY, Master Mariner, died on 27 February 1881, at his home at Woodville. He was 66 years of age. The cause of death was listed as Diarrhoea. The death was notified by George HADDY of Port Adelaide. (14)

His death was attended by members of the S. Aust. Yacht Club, in full uniform. (15)

He was survived by his three children, Daniel Thomas, Edward Charles, and Mary Elizabeth

DEATH OF CAPTAIN TAPLEY

Our Obituary notices this week contain the record of the death of Captain Daniel TAPLEY, who for some years has taken an active interest in all matters connected with the maritime affairs of the colony.

In early life the deceased gentleman traded between India and China in command of the Barque Tenassarim .

For many years he was master attendant at Moulmein in Burma, filled various other appointments in the service of the Honourable East India Company, and continued in the service when it transferred to the British Government.

Captain TAPLEY took an active part in the second Burmese war, being in charge of a Flotilla transporting troops to Martaban and Rangoon, and also having been engaged in storming parties, for which services he was honourably mentioned to the Government.

After over thirty years residence in Moulmein and Calcutta, and becoming invalided he retired to England on a well earned pension. Finding however, the winters at home too severe for

his constitution, he decided to come out to South Australia, and he reached the colony about ten years ago.

Shortly afterwards he was appointed a Warden of the Marine Board and notwithstanding his impaired health was a regular attendant at the meetings, and most assiduous in all the duties appertaining to the office. He was on board the MUSGRAVE during the last annual inspection, a few weeks ago, and in spite of weakness took part in all the examinations and work of the board. Captain TAPLEY died at his residence, Caversham, Woodville, on Saturday, at the age of sixty-six. He leaves two sons and a daughter, all resident in South Australia.

Daniel a Master Mariner, Ho. East India Co., and latterly replace his brother Richard on the S.A. marine Board.

Married Mary Jane KINSMAN, dau of Thomas C. KINSMAN and Mary.. on 12 June 1841, Moulmein

Daniel TAPLEY was commander of the 'TENASSERIM', one of the vessels of the Hon East India Company's navy. There were apparently two vessels by this name, one No. 30718 (British Registration) 216 tons of Calcutta, and another built in Moulmein 1841, of 760 tons, a steam vessel of 220 H.P.- variously 4 and 11 guns. After an unknown time he was appointed Second Assistant to Master Attendant in the Maritime Service and in charge of the Port of Moulmein; the Marine Establishment, Sengal, comprised of the Master Attendant and three assistants. In November 1861 he was put in charge of Kidderforce Dockyard which then included Naval Storekeeper, Builder and Surveyor; he resigned in April 1862 "having obtained leave to England on medical certificate". (From Mercantile Navy List 1857- Public record Office London, and Naval Progress for India for 1981-82- India Office London.)

Spouse of Daniel TAPLEY

Mary Jane KINSMAN (1825 -1866)

Mary Jane KINSMAN was born in 1825, and was the daughter of Thomas C. KINSMAN, a Captain in the H.E.I.C.S, and her mother was Mary KINSMAN (1798 - 1868). (1)

The family were living in Moulmein, Burma by the 1840s when Mary Jane married in 1841.

Mary Jane KINSMAN married at the age of 16 years on 12 June 1841, to Daniel TAPLEY, Commander of the Tenasserim, at the Church of St Matthew, at Moulmein. Her father, Thomas C. KINSMAN, signed the register giving his consent to the marriage. Witnesses were W.C. McLEOD, E.A. BLUNDELL, and J. LOGAN. The Minister was the Chaplain, Arthur HAMILTON. (2)

Mary Jane and Daniel TAPLEY were to have three children, all born at Moulmein, during the next few years.

155E2 Edward Charles TAPLEY, born 29 September 1845.

155E3 Mary Elizabeth TAPLEY, born 26 February 1847. (3)

In 1862, the family moved to England, and went to live at Ivy Cottage, Worth, in Kent.

Mary Jane was in poor health, and had contracted a heart disease, and died at home on 3 May 1866, of a longstanding Heart disease, and Cerebral Congestion. She was aged only 40 years. (4)

She was survived by her husband Daniel and their three children.

KINSMAN FAMILY**Thomas C. KINSMAN and Mary(1798 -1868)**

Thomas C. KINSMAN was married to Mary they had only one known child, Mary Jane KINSMAN born in about 1825. (1)

By 1841, they were living at Moulmein in Burma, when their daughter Mary Jane married Captain Daniel TAPLEY, in St Matthew's Church at Moulmein.

Thomas C. KINSMAN signed the Register to give his consent to his daughter's marriage at this time. (2)

It seems that Thomas KINSMAN was also in the Service of the East India Company, as on his wife's death certificate she was described as the widow of Thomas KINSMAN Captain in the H.E.I.C.S. These letters would have stood for the Honorable East India Company Service. (3)

Thomas KINSMAN had died some time prior to 1868.

His wife Mary had been living at Harriet Street, Sandwich, in Kent, England prior to her death. She died on 23 April 1868 at the age of 70 years, of Tuberculosis of long standing and natural decay. (4)
