1837 – 1903

155111 John Edward TAPLEY (1837- 1903)

Alias - Howard Tapley CLARTON.

John Edward TAPLEY was born on Mauritius in about the year 1837/8. His father was Richard Edward TAPLEY (1811-1891), a trader and teacher to the natives. His mother was Arabella TAPLEY (1805-1875). Her maiden name is not known. (1)

John was only about 6 years of age when he came to South Australia with his parents in 1843/44. (2)

John became an Agent by Occupation. The type of agent is not known, but he was residing at Norwood, probably with his parents by 1857. He may have been commonly known as Edward as this is how he signed his name as informant at the birth of his daughter Ruth in 1860.

John Edward TAPLEY, 19 years, agent of Norwood, married on 25 December 1857, to Ellen Masters BAKER, 20 years, of Morphett Vale.

Ellen was the daughter of the Reverend Edward BAKER, of Morphett Vale, and the marriage took place in his residence, Hill-side House, at Morphett Vale. The marriage was conducted by A. R. PHILPS, as officiating Minister.

The witnesses to the marriage were--

Edward BAKER, Minister of Morphett Vale- Father of
Ellen.

R. E. TAPLEY, Accountant, of Adelaide- Father of
John.

H.W. BAKER, of Morphett Vale- This was Ellen's sister
Harriet Whitridge BAKER. (3)

John and Ellen were to have only two children of their marriage--

1551111 A son Richard Howard TAPLEY, born 31 October 1858.(4)

1551112 Ruth Evelyn TAPLEY, born 22 March 1860, in Adelaide. John registered the birth, giving the name J. Edward TAPLEY, and described himself as a Gentleman of Adelaide. (5)

John was an agent by occupation and apparently went to India on business, and appears to have deserted Ellen, his wife, who was still in South Australia

Their daughter Ruth caught Bronchitis, and died as a result at Morphett Vale, on 5 September 1864. John was listed as an Agent of Morphett Vale at this time. (6)

Whatever the circumstances, it appears that Ellen either divorced John Edward TAPLEY some time during the 1860 to 1870 period, or had her married annulled, as she subsequently resumed her maiden name, and married later under the name Ellen Masters BAKER, to Charles Mosse SPRIGG in 1874. (7)

Meanwhile, in India, while on business, John TAPLEY had been instrumental in saving a small boy from drowning. An army doctor, by the name of BROWN, was present at the time, and was impressed by the rescue, and invited the young man home to dinner. When he told his wife and family about the incident, his younger daughter, Sarah, was enamoured of the event. A mutual attraction developed, and John and Sarah were subsequently married.

It appears likely that he changed to an assumed name at that time- taking the name Howard Tapley CLARTON. In 1862, Howard Tapley CLARTON, 25 years, married Sarah Clapp BROWN in Calcutta, India (John was still legally married to Ellen at this time, as John Edward TAPLEY). (8)

Whether he continued his business trips between Adelaide and Calcutta is uncertain although in 1864 he was listed at Morphett Vale when his daughter Ruth died, (see above), although the death was registered by John's father, Richard Edward TAPLEY.

His son Richard Howard TAPLEY, however, continued to reside in South Australia where he married and had 5 Children. (9).

As Howard Tapley CLARTON, John Edward TAPLEY and Sarah had 5 children born in India, presumably in Calcutta. These children were as follows-

1. (1551113) Annie Margaret CLARTON-born 1864
2. (1551114) Reginald Howard CLARTON- born 1866
3. (1551115) Harriet May CLARTON - born 1868.
4. (1551116) Agnes Jessie CLARTON- born 1870
5. (1551117) Winnifred Sarah CLARTON - born 1871 (10)

It seems likely that the family were living with Sarah's Father, who retired in 1872 and returned to Scotland. The family story indicates that Sarah and the children went with Sarah's father to Scotland also, until Howard (John) could set up a life for the family in Victoria.(11)

In 1874, in the Sands and McDougall references there was a John TAPLEY listed as living at Malvern and his occupation was a Treasury Clerk. (12)

It is possible that He was living a double life as John Edward TAPLEY in Adelaide, and Howard Tapley CLARTON, in Calcutta, with Sarah living with her father in India, and that matters came to a head when her father retired and returned to Scotland. John obviously could not take Sarah and her Children to South Australia because he was still married to Ellen, so he chose to move his second family to Melbourne, initially going there to get established.

However, Sarah arrived unexpectedly in Melbourne in February 1874, and the name John TAPLEY was not in the Directory for 1875, but the first mention of Howard CLARTON appears, and they were living at Hawthorne, Victoria.(13).

He lived the rest of his life as Howard Tapley CLARTON in Victoria and was listed as a Land Agent, and never was in a place more than about 4 years, moving about Victoria.

He and Sarah had a further 8 children in Victoria-

6. (1551118) Edward Dryden CLARTON- born 1874, possibly at sea.
7. (1551119) Richard Crombie CLARTON - born 1875 (died infant, age 6 months).- at Hawthorne, Victoria.
8. (155111A) Evelyn Kathleen (Kate) CLARTON - born 1877, died 1878., at Benalla.
9. (155111B) Laura Estelle CLARTON- born 1880 at Benalla, Vic.
10. (155111C) Aimee Maude CLARTON - born 1882 at Oakleigh, Vic.
11. (155111D) Bertie Fletcher CLARTON - Born 1883 at Oakleigh, Vic.
12. (155111E) Jack Warburton CLARTON -born 1885, died 1885.
13. (155111F) Rubybel (Rubiebell) CLARTON- born 1886, at Collingwood. (14)

While Sarah must have known of the other family, apparently the children were not aware of a second family, and they remembered him as an exemplary and much loved father according to a grand daughter. They were aware of the name change however from TAPLEY to CLARTON.

The TAPLEY Coat of Arms held in the Clarton Family has the Motto "Tout Change" inscribed on it, otherwise it is the same as the Arms ascribed to Thomas TAPLEY.

A Photograph of Howard Tapley CLARTON was taken in his latter years and on the bottom of the picture is an Arms with what appears to be a Griffin over a motto 'Tout Change', see reference section following..

In his latter years, apparently, Howard Tapley CLARTON became a chronic alcoholic, and died at the age of 67 years at Elsternwick, in Victoria of Chronic alcoholism and Pneumonia. The death was registered by Marion P. ATKINSON. His parents were listed as Richard Tapley CLARTON, manager of insurance and Arabella CLARTON (formerly McDONALD). Both of he parents were deceased by this time. Howard Tapley CLARTON was buried on 8 January 1903. (15)

Hi Louise,

I was reading the info, which you posted about John Edward Tapley Clarton.

I am not sure if you are aware of Gwyn Campbell's book *A Missionary History of Madagascar*. Ellen Baker's father, Edward, was a missionary in Madagascar and Mauritius - he and his family lived near the Tapley family when they lived at Piton in Mauritius. The Tapleys were also missionaries, running a school. Ruth Baker and Mrs Tapley might have come together from Mauritius with Ellen's sister, Emma, and whatever children Mrs Tapley had with her - possibly John

I have wondered if that's why Ellen married John, because of the link between the Tapleys and Bakers, going back to Mauritius.

Anyway I am getting off the point. Campbell on page 876, talks about how Ellen went to India to asked John to return to Australia, when he stopped sending money. He refused and she came home. She was successful in getting a divorce in October, 1873 and the next year married Charles Mosse Sprigg.

My interest is in the Bakers because Emma Baker was my great great grandfather's first wife.

TAPLEY/CLARTON FAMILY NOTES

The mystery formerly surrounding the whereabouts of John Edward TAPLEY (1837 - ?) after the early 1860's appears to have been answered in this particular family connection.

There is no doubt that Howard Tapley CLARTON as he was known in Victoria, and who was born in Mauritius about 1837, is connected with the TAPLEY Family.

Mrs Phyllis OAKES, his grand daughter, says that it was common knowledge in the family that he had changed his surname from TAPLEY to CLARTON.

According to his death Certificate, Howard Tapley CLARTON, "Agent", was the son of Richard Tapley CLARTON, Manager of Insurance, and Arabella CLARTON, formerly McDONALD.

His age at death was 67 years, at Elsternwick, Victoria, on 6 January 1903, which makes him born in about 1837 in Mauritius.

His death certificate also shows that he spent his last 26 years in Victoria, and an unknown time in Adelaide, South Australia. That is to say, he was in Victoria from about 1876 onwards.

His marriage is indicated at the age of 25 years, in Calcutta, India to Sarah Clapp BROWN. This would have been about the year 1862, that He married in India.

Howard and Sarah subsequently had 13 children of this marriage. The first 5 of whom were born in India, and the latter 8 in Victoria.

A request for a birth certificate from Mauritius by Mrs OAKES, failed to find any reference to a Howard TAPLEY.

However a Marriage Extract from Port Louis, Mauritius, was supplied for the marriage of Richard TAPLEY to Arabella McDONALD, on 7 July 1836.

The names of Richard TAPLEY, and Arabella, nee McDONALD, are those on the Death Certificate as his parents, with CLARTON added.

Richard Edward TAPLEY, and his wife Arabella only had one child, John Edward TAPLEY born on Mauritius in about 1837, who became an "Agent".

It would appear from the evidence available that John Edward TAPLEY, and Howard Tapley CLARTON are the same person, and that he changed his name to Howard when he assumed the surname CLARTON.

John came to South Australia with Richard and Arabella at the age of about 7 years, and grew up largely in South Australia.

John Edward TAPLEY had first married at the age of 19 years to Ellen Masters BAKER, at Morphett Vale, South Australia on 25 December 1857.

They had two children by this marriage, a son, Richard Howard TAPLEY, born 31 October 1858, and Ruth Evelyn TAPLEY, born 22 March 1860.

Soon after this references to John Edward TAPLEY in South Australia seem to disappear.

His daughter, Ruth Evelyn, died at the age of 4 years, in 1864, the death being notified by her grandfather Richard Edward TAPLEY, although John was mentioned on the certificate as Father, and an agent.

His son Richard Howard TAPLEY remained in South Australia and went to work for the Insurance firm begun by John's father Richard Edward TAPLEY. Incidentally this son went by the name Howard TAPLEY.

His wife Ellen resumed her maiden surname of BAKER by the 1870's and married under that name in 1874 to Charles M. SPRIGG.

Mrs OAKES indicates that Sarah and Howard lived for ten years in India, and when her father retired, he returned to Scotland. Sarah and her children went with him while Howard went to prepare a new life for them in Victoria.

Mrs OAKES research in Victorian records show that a John TAPLEY resided at Malvern in 1874, but no reference to him in 1875, but a Howard CLARTON was living at Hawthorne by this time, so he apparently changed his name about this time.

Sarah arrived in Melbourne with the children unexpectedly, about February of 1874.

Howard CLARTON is designated as a land agent on various birth certificates for the following 8 children, as the family moved around Victoria.

There appears to be a time, at least when John TAPLEY married Sarah BROWN in India, that he was still legally married to Ellen in South Australia.

Divorce in South Australia in the 1860s was extremely difficult for women. Divorce was available to men on the grounds of simple adultery but to women only on grounds of aggravated adultery: that is, only if the husband was involved in an incestuous relationship, bigamy, rape, or bestiality. A judicial separation was obtainable by males and females on equal terms - adultery, cruelty, or desertion without cause for a period of at least two years; it did not allow either party to remarry and was reversible. (From the Flinders Social History of South Australia).

Ellen was certainly deserted, and John appears to have committed bigamy, and that is probably the grounds for Ellen to obtain a divorce.

SPOUSES of JOHN EDWARD TAPLEY

(1/2) Ellen Masters BAKER (1838 - 1919)

Ellen Masters BAKER was born c. 1838 on Mauritius. Her father was Revd Edward BAKER (1806-1885), Minister of Religion, and her mother was Ruth -- (c1802-1885). (1)

The family moved to South Australia from Madagascar about 1845, and settled in South Australia, and lived variously at McLaren Vale, Morphett Vale and Reynella. (2)

On 25 December 1857, Ellen Masters BAKER, aged 20 years, of Morphett Vale, married John Edward TAPLEY, 19 years, of Norwood. They were married at the home of Rev Edward BAKER (father of Ellen). Ellen's father was a witness, as was her sister Harriett. The Revd A.R. PHILPS officiated. (3)

Ellen and John had two children of their marriage.

1. Richard Howard TAPLEY- born 31 October 1858 (4)
2. Ruth Evelyn TAPLEY - Born 22 March 1860, and died at the age of 4 years on 5 September 1864. (5)

It appears that during the next few years that Ellen divorced John Edward TAPLEY, as a few years later she re-married, under her maiden name.

On 2 September 1874, Ellen Masters BAKER, married Charles Mosse SPRIGG, a widower, at Morphett Vale. (6)

Ellen and Charles SPRIGG had 1 Child of their marriage.

1. Charles Arthur Mosse SPRIGG , born at Morphett Vale on 8 January 1878
- There were also two children of Charles from his first marriage to Margaret HAY. These were :
- Hedley Vicars SPRIGG born Morphett Vale on 26 Aug 1864
 - Emma Frances SPRIGG born at Morphett Vale on 3 January 1866. (7)

Ellen and Charles SPRIGG also brought up William WILLIAMSON, who died as a young man. (8)

Ellen's husband Charles died on 29 September 1904 (9)

Ellen herself died on 18 August 1919 at Morphett Vale. (10)
She is buried at Morphett Vale.

Sarah Clapp BROWN, was the daughter of a British Army Doctor. Dr BROWN was stationed in Calcutta India, at least for much of Sarah's early life.

One day her father told the family of a young man who had saved a boy from drowning and he had invited this young man to dinner. Sarah was apparently enamoured with this, and when she met the young man they assumed a mutual attraction.

It is uncertain by what name he was introduced initially to the family, but he became known to the BROWN family as Howard Tapley CLARTON (actually John Edward TAPLEY).

Initially Sarah was told that she could not marry Howard until her older sister first married. Sarah was sent to her grandmother in Calcutta to forget the young man. Here she went on a hunger strike until her grandmother wrote and appealed to the family to relent and let her marry lest she died.

The BROWN family relented, and Sarah Clapp BROWN married John Edward TAPLEY under the alias of Howard Tapley CLARTON, in Calcutta, India, in 1862.

Over the next ten years in India, at Calcutta, Sarah and Howard had 5 Children born-

1. Annie Margaret CLARTON-born 1864.
2. Reginald Howard CLARTON - born 1866.
3. Harriet May CLARTON - born 1868
4. Agnes Jessie CLARTON - born 1870.
5. Winnifred Sarah CLARTON - born 1871.

Sarah's father retired from the Army Medical Service in 1872 and returned to Scotland, and Sarah accompanied him, while her husband Howard Tapley CLARTON went to Victoria, Australia, to get a new life established for the family.

Sarah apparently arrived in Melbourne on the Ship BEN CRUCHAN, in February of 1874, unexpectedly, as her husband was working as a Treasury Clerk under his real name of John TAPLEY, and was living at Malvern, at that time.

When Sarah arrived, he switched names to Howard Tapley CLARTON, and they were living at Hawthorne, in 1875.

They had a further 8 children born in Victoria

6. Edward Dryden CLARTON, born 1874 (possibly at Sea on the journey out)
7. Richard Crombie CLARTON- born 1875-died aged 6 months, at Hawthorne.
8. Evelyn Kate CLARTON born 1877-died 1878 at Benalla.
9. Laura Estelle CLARTON -born 1880 at Benalla.
10. Aimee Maude CLARTON- born 1882 at Oakleigh.
11. Bertie Fletcher CLARTON - born 1883 at Oakleigh.
12. Jack Warburton CLARTON - born and died 1885
13. Rubiebell (Rubybel) CLARTON - born 1886, at Collingwood..

The family moved around Victoria quite a lot not spending more than three or four years in any one place. Howard worked as a Land Agent.

Towards the end of his life, Howard Tapley CLARTON became a chronic alcoholic.

Apparently during this time, some of the younger children were farmed out to live with their married sister. This certainly happened to the youngest child, Ruby, who went to live at Mt. Dandenong with her sister May, who had children of her own by this time.

Sarah and Howard were living at Elsternwick, Victoria when he died on 6 January 1903.

Sarah Clapp CLARTON, nee BROWN, died some time later in Melbourne in 1918.

CHILDREN OF JOHN EDWARD AND ELLEN MASTERS TAPLEY

1551111 RICHARD HOWARD TAPLEY (1858-1819)

Richard Howard TAPLEY was born in South Australia, on 31 October 1858. His father was John Edward TAPLEY (1838- ?), Agent, and his mother was Ellen Masters TAPLEY, nee BAKER (1838-1919). (1)

Richard Howard TAPLEY became a clerk by occupation, and was working by the time he married probably for the South Australian Insurance Company. (2)

He may have been commonly known as Howard, as when he registered the birth of two of his children he gave his name as R. Howard TAPLEY.

On 20 December 1882, at the age of 24 years, Richard Howard TAPLEY, bachelor, Clerk of Adelaide, married Mariana (Purefoy) SPRIGG, 26 years, spinster of Glanville(?). The marriage was held at the Wesleyan Church, Clarendon, and the officiating Minister was Paul C. THOMAS.

Witnesses were--Henry A Lloyd, of Norwood, and someone from Clarendon (3).

Richard and Mariana TAPLEY were to have 5 children in the following 10 years.

15511111 Rachel May TAPLEY born 23 September 1883 at Young Street, Parkside. Richard was an Inspector for the S.A. Fire Insurance Co. (4)

15511112 Willis Wayte TAPLEY, born 13 October 1885, at Young St., Parkside. Richard still Inspector. (5)

15511113 Ellen Gertrude TAPLEY, born 1 June 1887 at Young Street, Parkside. (6)

15511114 Irene Purefoy TAPLEY, born at Parkside 18 April 1889. Richard still and Inspector. (7)

15511115 Amy Mordaunt TAPLEY, born at Young Street Parkside, on 25 May 1891. Richard was listed as 2nd Officer of the South Australian Insurance Company. (8)

15511116 Kathleen Mosse TAPLEY , was born on 17 March 1894, at Glenelg.). (9)

It seems likely that he was generally known as Howard TAPLEY, as when he registered the births of his children Willis, Irene and Amy, he signed his name as R. Howard TAPLEY.

By 1897 Richard H. TAPLEY was living at Washington Street, Glenelg. (10)

Richard Howard TAPLEY died on 11 January 1919, at the age of 60 years. He is buried in the West Terrace Cemetery, Adelaide, S.Aust. (11)

Rubiebelle (or Rubybel) CLARTON, was born at Collingwood in Victoria, in 1886. She was the youngest and 13th child of Howard Tapley CLARTON (1837-1903), a Land Agent, and Sarah Clapp CLARTON, nee BROWN (1838-1918).

She was named after an Indian Flower, but was commonly known in the family as Ruby. Following are the biographical notes on her life written by her daughter, Phyllis OAKES, nee WATT.

“ My Mother was only five foot but a human dynamo always trying to do numbers of things at once and succeeding. She had the confidence that all the Clartons had in their own ability, and although I always thought of her as the quiet one in this family of extravagant personalities, it didn't mean that she had little to say. She was a born story teller, and it is from her that I heard the family stories, exaggerated, embellished, but never completely without some fact.

“When she was born number thirteen in the family she was bright red, so they decided to call her after an Indian flower. ‘I suppose it could have been worse’ she always said. ‘They could have called me by the Indian name.’ She hated her name and claimed other names in other places but was called in the family just Ruby.

“Her education was practically non-existent, and most of what she had came from the little village school at Mount Dandenong, when she stayed with her sister May and her family. There was just two years between Mother and May's daughter Rhoda. Mount Dandenong in those days was a fruit farming area and was settled by German immigrants. They started the school day by singing ‘The Fatherland’. I often wondered why May, who worked so hard, and had five children of her own would bother to look after her younger brothers and sisters as well. I think now that Howard had started his heavy drinking and Sarah was trying to get the younger children out of the house. My mother did not know that Howard drank and thought he died when she was twelve, but actually she was about sixteen when he died and I think she must have been with her sister in Malaysia at that time.

“Mother always said that she started work at twelve because the family were in such poor circumstances. Howard would have been in Perth at this time. She joined her sister in the workshop, sewing for a big department store. She loved the work and later, she was trained by the company to be a cutter and designer. She was good at it and was always able to get a job anywhere on the strength of her references. She even started a small business of her own - daring for the twenties.

“ At about sixteen however she got the wonderful opportunity to live with her sister Jessie as her companion. Jessie's third marriage had been to a civil engineer whose main work seemed to be in Asian countries. A doting husband, Jessie wanted for nothing, her clothes, and now Mother's, were made in Paris and shipped out to Singapore for them. In Malaysia she lived a very social life full of exciting adventure, tiger shoots that she attended in a howdah on an elephant, vice-regal balls, and with the English Army stationed in Singapore she received a lot of attention, and many proposals of marriage, but also she contracted various fevers and finally after about two years for her health's sake she was sent home. Her life could never be the same again.

“Melbourne was too cold for her so she came to Sydney.

“In Sydney she worked for Grace Brothers, a great Department Store sprawling over two city blocks in the then fashionable end of town. Every now and then she would pack her bags and go and live for a while in Perth, Melbourne, or Adelaide, and when she was in Melbourne she often lived for many months, sometimes years with her sisters and brothers, so growing up with their children as an elder sister. She had been engaged several times but neither engagement had progressed to marriage.

“In her forties, in Sydney, she was living in the same boarding house as my father, a Scotsman who had emigrated out hoping to find a position as a violinist. He was trained as a baker and pastrycook, and found that Australia needed bakers more than she needed violinists. He was lonely and Mother could talk about Scotland, where she had never been but from where her mother had come. When they decided to marry they found out that Mother was seventeen years older than Father (John WATT). They were sent

home to think about it but decided to go ahead anyhow and in the middle of the depression they married (1929), and opened a cake shop in Bondi. I was born the next year.

“When the Sydney Harbour Bridge opened I was carried across on my Father’s shoulders. He decided that the North Shore was then going to boom and we should be a part of it. He bought a bakehouse and shop in Lane Cove where I still live, and although he mumbled about making a mistake and landing up in a sleepy hollow the shop in Lane Cove was the first of a line of shops he opened in the Northern suburbs. A hard worker but a quiet man, I believe much of his success was due to my Mother, a great saleswoman.

Whenever one of the shops was not doing as well as it should he always called on Mother to take over the running of the business to get it on its feet again, and she did.

“I can’t say it was a successful marriage. My Father became an alcoholic, and had always been a great one for the ladies. Even though there was much unhappiness for my Mother they remained good friends, fond of each other and being able to communicate. Father retired at 45 and became a wanderer finally settling in Perth and driving overland to Sydney each Christmas for some years.”

Rubiebelle WATT, nee CLARTON, died in 1957, in Sydney, New South Wales.

(John Mansfield OAKES, who was born 8 June 1924, is a descendant of John SMALL, a convict on the CHARLOTTE in the First Fleet, who became Governor Phillip's Sergeant at Arms, and was known as 'The Sergeant'. His daughter, Rebecca, married the missionary, Francis OAKES, who became the first constable at Parramatta, and the man whom Bligh sent to arrest MacArthur. His failure to persuade MacArthur to just come and talk things over was the beginning of the Rum Rebellion, and Bligh's third mutiny.)
